

Deed book 31 page 216-7 dated 1802-05-21

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN, WE whose names are hereunto subscribed and seals affixed send GREETING whereas it has been represented to us that the President, Directors and first Company of the Great Western Turnpike road may in continuing the said road to the City of Albany cause it to be laid across our respective lands in the direction lately run by Benjamin Gilbert and we are disposed to aid the said operation therefore KNOW YE that if the said road shall be laid out in the direction aforesaid we do each of us for himself agree to and with the said President Directors and Company to accept as a compensation for such of our lands as may be appropriated by them for making the said Turnpike road of the breadth of six rods across our respective tracts or farms and for all damages by us sustained by reason of such appropriations the sums hereunto annexed to our respective names but if the said road shall not be laid out in the direction aforesaid then these presents as to such of us in whose lands a departure from such survey shall happen shall be void IN WITNESS whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the 21st day of May, 1802.

I therefore allow the deed to be recorded as to the execution of William McKown.
