Paving projects: As final steps toward completion of the stormwater drainage improvement project, Delaware Engineering has let us know that, weather permitting, work at intersections will take place on the following dates:

Monday, April 24: Milling at intersections of Parkwood, Glenwood, and Norwood Streets Tuesday, April 25: Replacement of traffic signal loops at Parkwood and Norwood Streets Wednesday, April 25: Paving at intersections of Glenwood and Norwood Streets

It will be helpful if, as much as possible, residents keep travel in those areas to a minimum so that the work to restore the intersections can be performed safely and efficiently.

Additionally, later this year the Town Highway Department plans to repave the following McKownville streets: Elmwood, Glenwood, Norwood, Parkwood, Country, Dillenbeck, E. Highland, Oak, Shady & Valley. Supervisor Barber will provide more information on this subject at our meeting.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day will take place on Saturday, April 22, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Guilderland Public Library auxiliary parking lot. This is an opportunity to safely dispose of prescription medications. Research shows that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from home medicine cabinets. The event will be free and anonymous. No needles will be accepted.

McKownville-Country Club Highlands Historic District: Our roadside marker, provided through a grant from the William G. Pomeroy Foundation, is now installed in front of 1443 Western Avenue. We extend our thanks to the homeowner for allowing the sign to be placed there. This location is especially significant because the original owners of the "Benjamin and Caroline Witbeck House" were the people mainly responsible for the development of Country Club Highlands, now a national historic district. The Witbecks lived in the house beginning in 1914. Benjamin died in 1942, but Caroline continued to live there until 1960.
