

THIS INDENTURE Made the 9th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four
BETWEEN Charles A. Denison and Emily his
 wife of the City of Albany of the first part and Mary E.
 Benedict of the same place of the second part
WITNESSETH
 That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration
 of the sum of Twenty Two hundred dollars lawful
 money of the United States of America to them in hand
 paid by the said party of the second part the receipt
 whereof is hereby confirmed and acknowledged have
 granted bargained sold conveyed aliened remised released
 enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents
 doth grant bargain sell convey alien remise release
 enfeoff and confirm unto the said party of the
 second part and to her heirs and assigns forever
 All that certain piece or parcel of land situate lying
 and being in the City of Albany in what was formerly
 the ninth Ward of said City and being a portion
 of the property purchased by the said parties of
 the first part from Samuel Gross Esq & Rachel E.
 his wife by deed the 14th day of March 1868 and
 recorded in Albany County Clerks office in book number
 27 Page 15 on the 22^d of April 1868 the price of land
 hereby conveyed is bounded and described as follows
 to wit beginning at a stake in the southerly line of
 the water works and runs thence south $47^{\circ} 50' 11\frac{1}{2}$ chains
 and 52 links to a stake thence north $42^{\circ} 10' 11\frac{1}{2}$ chains
 to the south west corner of the lot herein described
 thence north $47^{\circ} 50'$ E. 15 chains and 6 links to the southern
 line of the water works thence along the southerly line
 of the water works to the place of beginning containing
 twenty two acres of land the foregoing land hereby conveyed
 is bounded on the east by Magazine street on the south by
 property owned by Elzie Kins and lately sold to her
 by the said party of the first part the foregoing land
 hereby conveyed is a part of a 46 acre lot purchased
 of Samuel Gross and wife by the said party of the
 first part paid 46 acre lot is bounded as follows on
 by Washington Avenue east by Magazine St south by
 Syden St now Madison Avenue and west by lot number
 20 the intention is to convey twenty two acres of land
 surveyed last fall by William Elliger and on the 21st

TOGETHER with all and singular the hereditaments
 and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise
 pertaining and the reversion and reversions
 and remainders real names and profite therefrom
 the said tract of land to the intent above and demanded
 of the said party of the first part to be given up
 to the said party of the second part to be held by
 her and her heirs and assigns forever

the said headments and appurtenances **TO HAVE**
AND TO HOLD the above mentioned and described
premises with the appurtenances and every part and
parcel thereof to the said party of the second part his
heirs and assigns forever and the said Charles Adenison
& Emily his wife for themselves their heirs executors
and administrators do covenant promise and agree 1.
and with the said party of the second part her heirs
and assigns to warrant and forever to defend the above
granted premises and every part and parcel thereof
now being in the quiet and peaceable possession
of the said party of the second part against the
parties of the first part then and now and all other
successors and assigns and against all and
persons or persons claiming or to claim the said premises
or any part thereof **IN WITNESS WHEREOF**
the said parties of the first part have hereunto set their
hands and sealed it this day and year first aforesaid.
