**THIS INDENTURE** Made this Eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy six **BETWEEN** Charles A. Devison and Emily his wife of the City & County of Albany and State of New York parties of the first part Ed Thomas Chambers of the Town of Bethlehem County and State aforesaid party of the second part.

**WITNESSETH** That the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand five hundred (\$2500) Dollars to them duly paid have sold and by these Presents do grant and convey to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns.

**ALL** That certain piece or parcel of land Situate lying & being in the City of Albany N.Y. in what was formerly the Ninth Ward of said City and being a portion of the property purchased by the said parties of the first part from Samuel Grose & wife by Deed bearing date March 14<sup>th</sup> 1868 and Recorded in Albany County Clerk's Office April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1868 in Book No 2077 Page 15 the piece of land hereby conveyed is bounded & described as follows viz: Beginning at a stake in the Southernly line of the Water Works 4 runs thence South 47° 50' West 12 chains & 52 links to a stake thence North 42° 10' West 16 chains to the south west corner of the lot herein described thence North 47° 50' East 15 chains and 6 links to the Southernly line of the Water Works thence along the same Southernly line of the Water Works to the place of Beginning containing Twenty two (22) Acres of land according to a survey made by W<sup>m</sup> Stingerland in the year A.D. 1873 and being same premises conveyed to said parties of first part by Deed executed by Mary E. Benedict bearing date December 12<sup>th</sup> 1874.

**WITH THE APPURTENANCES** and all the estate title and interest therein of the said parties of the first part And the said Charles A. Devison doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns that the premises thus conveyed in the quiet & peaceable possession of the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns that he will forever warrant and defend against any person whatsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.

of December in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and seventy five (1875). **BETWEEN**  
Stephen Draper of the City of Troy in the County of  
Rensselaer and State of New York and Healthy G. his  
wife parties of the first part and Hiram Mann of  
the Village of West Troy in the County of Albany and  
State aforesaid party of the second part. **WITNESSETH**  
That the said parties of the first part in consider-  
ation of the sum of Twenty five hundred (\$2500.00)  
Dollars to them duly paid have sold and by this  
present do grant and convey to the said part-  
of the second part his heirs and assigns **ALL** that  
certain piece or tract of land situate lying and  
being in the Village of West Troy County of Albany  
and State of New York being part of farm lot  
number Four (4) and which said piece or parcel of  
land hereby intended to be conveyed is bounded and  
described as follows viz Beginning at a point on  
the East side of Ford Street one hundred feet (100) South  
from the South line of Auburn Street and running  
thence Easterly on a line parallel with the South  
line of said Auburn Street one hundred feet (100)  
running thence Southerly on a line parallel with  
the said East line of Ford Street and one hundred  
feet Easterly therefrom one hundred and twenty five  
feet (125) thence Westerly on a line parallel with the  
South line of said Auburn Street one hundred  
and twenty five feet (125) thence Southerly on a line parallel with the  
said East line of Ford Street one hundred feet (100) and running  
thence Easterly on a line parallel with the South line of said Auburn Street  
one hundred feet (100) to the point of beginning.
