

THIS INDENTURE Made the fifteenth day of December in the year
of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three Between
Edward McCreary Sheriff of the County of Albany of the first part
and Howard Van Nesselaer of the City and County of Albany State
of New York of the second part Whereas by virtue of a certain
Execution issued out of the Supreme Court at the suit of Anna
Van Nesselaer against Aaron W. Headrick a defendant
duly process served and delivered to the said Edward McCreary commanding
him that of the goods and chattels of the said defendant he should
cause to be made certain moneys or the said execution
specified and if sufficient goods and chattels could not be found
that then he should cause the account so specified to be made
of the lands tenements real estate and chattels real which the
said defendant had on a day in the said execution mentioned
or at any time afterwards in whose hands sooner the same
might be and the said Edward McCreary in obedience to the
command of the said execution did lay in and seize all the
estate right title and interest which the said defendant so had
of in and to the premises herein after named and described and
in the tenth day of September 1862 one thousand eight hundred and
two sold the said premises at public vendue at the City Hall
in the City of Albany N.Y. in the said County having first
given public notice of the time and place of such sale by
advertising the same according to law at which sale the
said premises were struck off to Howard Van Nesselaer for
the sum of one thousand dollars he being the highest
bidder and that being the highest sum bidde for the same

Note THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH That the said party of the first
part as sheriff as aforesaid by virtue of the said execution
and in pursuance of the statute in such case made and
provided and in consideration of the sum of money so
bidde as aforesaid to him duly paid hath sold and by
these presents doth grant and convey unto the said party
of the second part all the right title and interest of
Aaron W. Headrick as in and to ~~all~~ that certain piece
of land situate lying and being in the town of
Guilderland Albany County N.Y. formerly the tenth
ward of the City of Albany N.Y. and being a part of the land
conveyed by Christian P. LaGrange to John Archer by
Deed dated December 14, 1863 and recorded in Albany
County Clerks office in Book 183 of deeds at page 206^{and}
conveyed by John Archer to Austin Archer April 17, 1868^{and}
by Austin Archer to A. Van Meter and by A. Van Meter to Matilda
H. Archer by deed dated January 1, 1869 and recorded in Book
224 of deeds page 381 and more particularly described as
follows Beginning at a point in the south line of Madison
Street distant fifteen chains and fifty four $\frac{1}{4}$ links from the
point of intersection of said line with the west line of land
formerly owned and occupied by Anna Wallen Beck which

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first line was heretofore known and distinguished as
the Cooper line and running thence southward parallel
with said Cooper line eight (8) chains and eighty one (81) links
thence easterly and parallel with the south line of Madison Avenue
four (4) chains and fifty four (54) links to said Cooper line thence
northerly along said Cooper line fourteen (14) chains and nineteen
(19) links to the east line of land heretofore described as
conveyed to Matilda H. Archer thence westerly and parallel
with the south line of Madison Avenue eight (8) chains and
thirty five (35) links to land heretofore
conveyed by Benjamin G. Hendrickson to Margaret O'Brien
thence northerly and along the east line of said land
thirty three (33) chains to the south line of Madison Avenue
and thence easterly and along said line thirty (30) chains
and twenty one and three quarters ($1\frac{3}{4}$) links to the place of
beginning Being the parcel of land conveyed by
Matilda H. Archer and Austin Archer to Benjamin G.
Hendrickson by deeds dated August 11, 1869 and recorded
in Albany County, Deeds office, in Book 226 of deeds at
page 151 excepting therefrom the lands conveyed as aforesaid
by Benjamin G. Hendrickson to Margaret O'Brien by
deed recorded in Albany County, Deeds office in Book 254
of deeds page 176. **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the said above
mentioned land conveyed premises **WITH THE APPURTENANCES** unto
the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns
forever as fully and absolutely as the said party of the
first as Sheriff can or ought to sell and convey the same
by virtue of the said execution and the law relating
thereto **IN WITNESS WHEREOF** the said Edward McCleary hath
hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first
