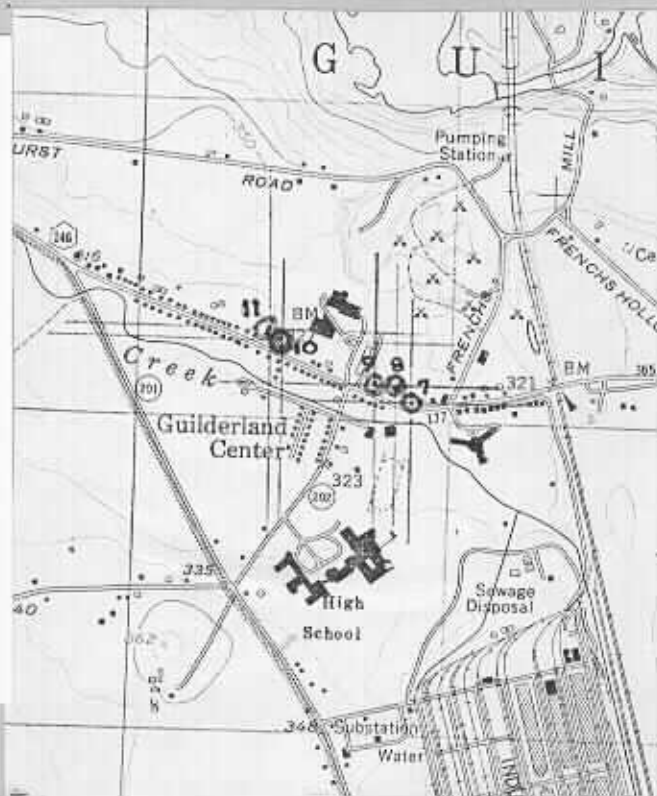

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

One of only several cobblestone buildings in the county, Schoolhouse #6 has been carefully maintained by the Guilderland School District since its construction in 1860. Exceptionally well executed in a traditional nineteenth-century construction technique indigenous to the northeast but rare in this vicinity, the structure survives amidst a contemporary suburban community. It is the best preserved cobblestone structure in the town and is a significant historical and architectural resource of the community. Schoolhouse #6 is now used as a storage building by the school district.

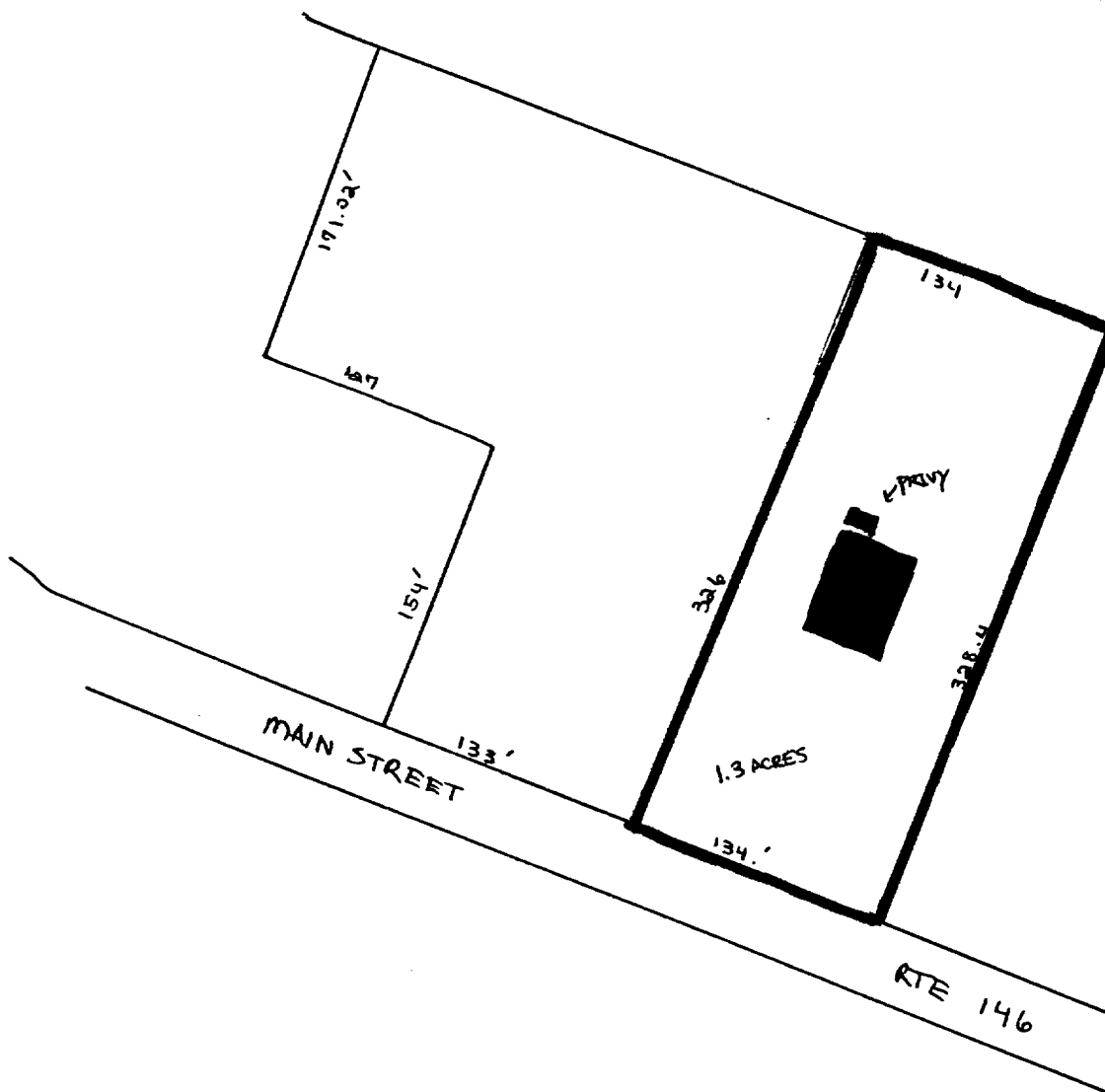

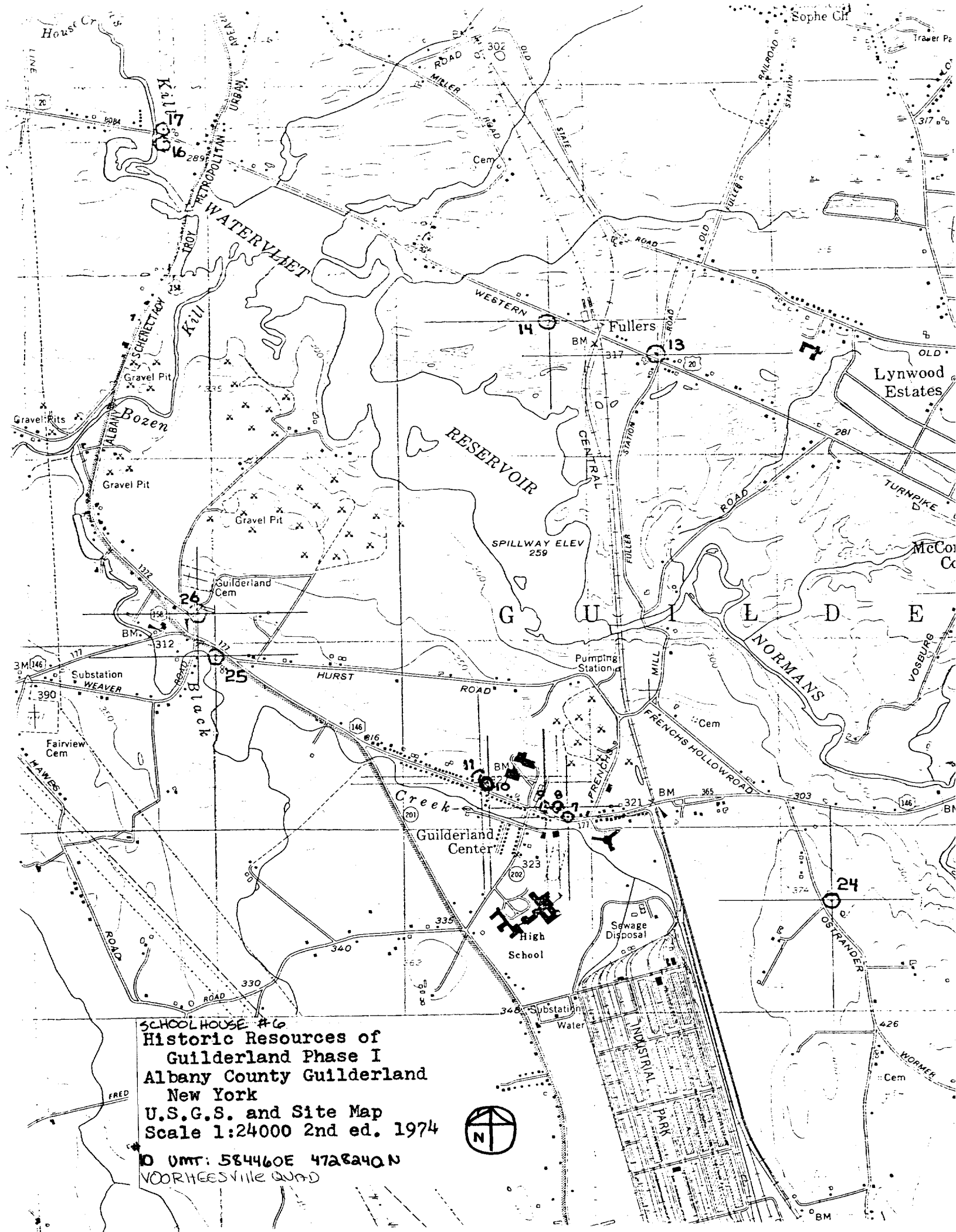
