WITNESSETH, That the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars lawful money of the United States of America to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged has granted bargained sold conveyed, aliened remised released enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell convey alien remise release encouff and confirm unto the sold party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever. ALL that certain piece or parcel of par land situate lying and being in a tract of land commonly called the Gere in said Tewn of Guilde rland and Knewn as Let Ne. 1 in the first parcel of the Gere. Beginning at a stone in the south west corner of the first parteel and south east corner of the second parcel and runs along the westerly line of the first parcel north 40 degrees east 21 chains and 27 links to a stone the northwest corner of the first part and north east corner of the second parcel then south 46 degrees east along the corporation line 58 chains and 50 links to a post then south 44 degrees west 18 chains and 48 links to a post in Bettys line then north westerly along Bettys line to the place of beginning. Containing one hundred and thirteen (113) acres and thirty two (32) perches of land together with the buildings thereen being the same lot and buildings known and fermerly occupied as a Taworn stand by the said party of the first part. And the said party of the first part for himself for his heis, executors and administrators doth covenant promise and agree to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns to warrant and forever to efend the above granted premises and every part and parcel thereof new being in the quist and geaceable pessession of the said party of the second part against the said party of the first part his heirs executors administrators and assigns and against all and every other person or porsons claiming or to claim the said promises or any part there of.
