KNOW YE, that for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars, to me in hand paid, HAVE granted, bargained and sold, and BY THESE PRESENTS, BOTH grant, bargain and sell to the PRESIDENT, Directors and FIRST COMPANY OF THE GREAT WESTERN TURNPIKE ROAD:

ALL the land wherof I am seized or entitled to on the track of the turnpike road, of the said PRESIDENT, DIRECTORS & COMPANY, their successors and assigns, to and for the only use of the said President, Directors and Company, their successors and assigns forever. And further, I do hereby release, exonerate and discharge the said PRESIDENT, DIRECTORS & COMPANY, and BY THESE PRESENTS do release, exonerate and discharge the said PRESIDENT, DIRECTORS & COMPANY of and from all actions, claims or demands of damages which I may have or be entitled to by reason of the construction of the turnpike road, by the President, Directors and Company through my land as aforesaid.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and three.
