AND WERREAS the said party of the Second part bath arrived at full age and an agreement has been entered into between the said John and all the male children of the said Abealon who have arrived at full age limiting the said John to the use and secury so much of the monday land of the said farm as is described in the said Will as being on the south side of the creek with the barn thereon for five years from first of August A.D. 1845 and to be unmelected in such occupancy and to use the said Barn and take off any hay or produce stored therein ustil the first of April next after the said five years with free pessage to the said John ever the said farm for the purpose of such use and decupancy. AND WERETAS the said party of the first part bath in execution of the trusts confided to him preceded to divide thesaid farm in pursuance of the said will emerget the male children of the said Absalan (who is now deceased) who here arrived at twenty one years of age and bath divided allotted and set off to the said party of the second part to these presents a portion of the said farm including in such division and allotment what is designated in the said Will as the saw mill let and which promises so set off to the party of the Second part to bounded and described as follows, to wit. NOW THEREPORE THIS INDESTURE WITHESSETS that the said party of the first part in consideration of the premises and of the sum of One Dollar to him in hand paid at or before the ensealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged bath granted, remised, released, and forever quitelained and by these presents doth grant, remise, release and forever quitelaim unto the said party of the Second part and to his heirs and assigns ferever, All the let, piece or parcel of ground hereimbefore particularly mentioned and described together with the heredicaments and appurtemances to the same belonging or appertaining TO HAVE AND TO HOLD thesame to the said party of the Second part his beire and assigns forever in as full and emple a manner as he the said John can or might convey the same as Trustee as aforesaid under the said Will subject however only to the right franchise and privilege of the said John and his local representatives his and their servants and teams of any necessary and convenient passage over any part of the said prepises for the occupancy and use by him of the said Meadow land during the term aforesaid to which he is extitled to the use thereof, IS WITNESS WEEREOF the said John McKown bath hereto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written.
