
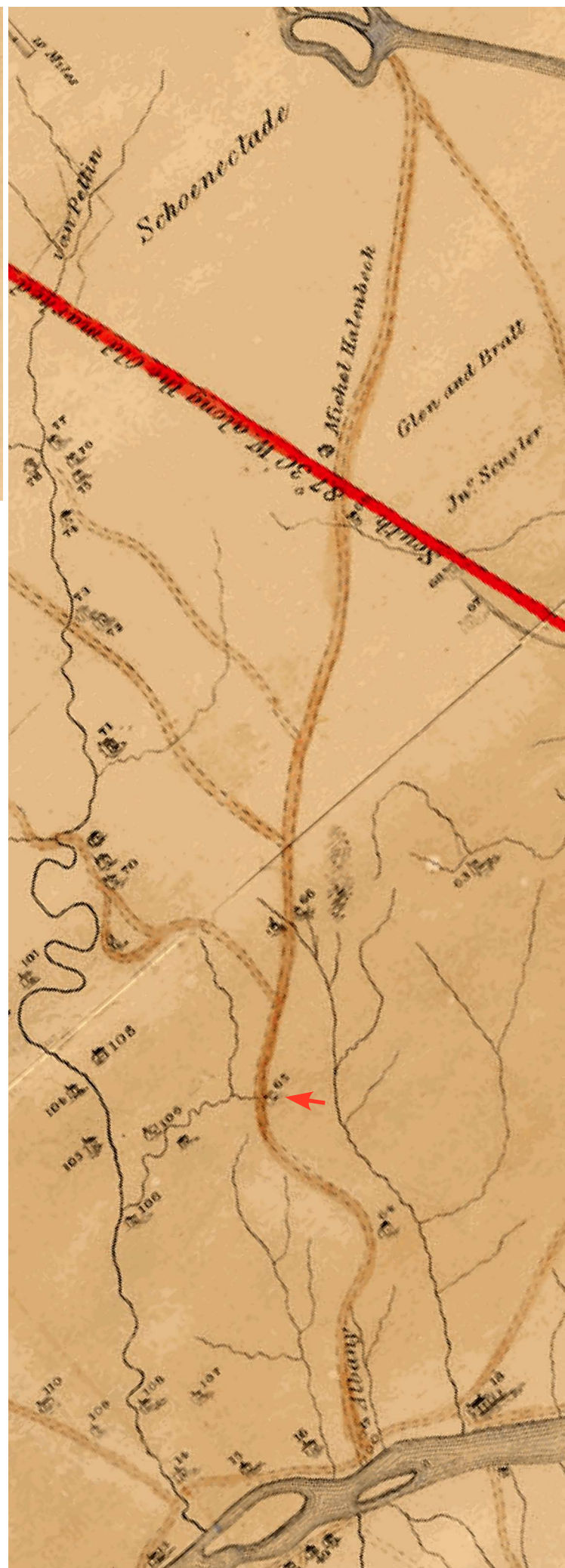

Red arrows highlight the “Five Mile House” (65) on the map and in the extract of the tenant list, the place occupied then by John Richies, at the Knil.

The Kings Highway is shown running past this place, starting from Albany and the Hudson River at the bottom of this map extract, and ending at Schenectady (Schoenectade) and the Mohawk River at the top.

The red line on this map extract is the northern boundary of the Manor.
