Again let me thank you for the fine presentation you made to the McKownville Improvement Association on October 2, 2001. McKownville residents are pleased to have the University as a neighbor. We use the University much like a public park and the University has always welcomed us. McKownville residents, whether employed at the University or not, are interested in what the University is doing, as you undoubtedly could tell from the questions.

We spoke briefly about plantings on a portion of the University "ring road" to buffer the noise from the road traffic. The strip along the ring road--University Drive West-- that is most relevant is south of the larger parking lot adjoining the RACC and north of the end of Knowles Terrace. Unlike the hilly portion that buffers the Holt-Harris property on the western edge of the RACC parking lot, this strip is flat or downward sloping to the residences and proceeds east from the hill. The portion of University Drive West that borders Knowles Terrace properties is about 500 feet long.

The rerouting of the road several years ago brought traffic closer to Knowles Terrace. The result is more noise for the residents.

Evergreen bushes, such as dwarf cypress, prostrate and various short yews, various arborvitae and the shorter common juniper, would be appropriate since they would neither grow tall nor loose their foliage during the winter. But also, the evergreen bushes would present a more bucolic appearance for University personnel driving or walking along that portion of the University ring road.

The cost should not be very great and, if burdensome in this time of State budget shortfalls, could be done incrementally, a few portions at a time.
