The report on the McKownville reservoir and park--when can we expect to see the report and can you give us an idea about what it is going to say?

Sidewalks--there is the McEneny money and then there are other monies in the pipeline--how much of this is going to be allocated to McKownville?

Drainage--there are flooding problems part of which might be caused by having an undersized pipe under Western near Stuyvesant. Is there any progress on getting some progress here?

What about the drains along Western, like at Glenwood and the ones under some peoples houses and so forth--what can you tell us about getting some improvements here?

The playground near Providence street--is anything happening to get that built?

Streetlights--what is the most effective way to get information to you about where we want more streetlights? Do we need a petition from the street or what?

Paths--there are a number of paths in McKownville--some of which need signs, like the path to Abele Park off of McKown Road and some paths need improvement like the one from Providence to Stuyvesant. What can you tell us about those?

Do not block side street signs for Providence and Mercer on Fuller--can we expect to see those in the near future?

The new CESTM buildings and Sematec--the original chip factory proposal was turned down in Rensselaer County because of fear of air pollution but I have not heard anyone question the air pollution effects from Sematec and CESTM. Do you know what kinds of air problems we are going to be exposed to?

Speed limits--we are are still trying to get the speed limit reduced to 30 MPH on Western. Can you give us some help on this one?

Toxic household waste like old paint cans--we seem to have some problems getting rid of it. What are we supposed to do?

We have been working to prevent ever more commercial development at this end of Town. What else should we be doing?
