I am writing to you to express my opposition to the proposal of the Thruway Authority to construct an EZPass lane along the Northway in the Hamlet of M. Enwardille, Town of Collderland - The Hamlet of M. Kowoville is an established residential heighborhood. Over the years, it has been severely impacted by the construction of the Northway, as well as, commercial dovolenment.

The Guilderland Town Board is committed to working towards the preservation of our neighborhoods and our residents quality of life. Several years ago, the New York State Repartment of Transportation invialled ramble stripe in the Northway which resulted in holse levels impacting the residential quality of life in the McKownville area. Through the efforts of the Town and our state legislators, we were successful in having the rumble strips removed. The present Thraway Authority proposal is many times more detrimental to the quality of life in McKownville than the rumble strips
