Thanks for the feedback. I understand exactly what you're saying - it seems a lot of trouble to go through (the mods to allow I-90 east and Fuller bypass from the new exit) and if it were up to me I wouldn't bother.

But when I realized what the engineers were up to in stipulating a two lane Western Avenue flyover as part of the barrier concepts I realized that I needed to show that there was another way to accomplish the same thing.

Their objective is to get all of the northbound exiting traffic out of the plaza to eliminate the weaving issues with traffic exiting from the west. So I wanted to illustrate another way of doing that without a Western Avenue flyover. And I wanted to show that this approach would be superior to the Western Avenue flyover approach in that it would continue to allow northbound traffic to get to Western Avenue - something the Western Avenue flyover approach eliminates.

If the Authority says that the 'weaving' in the plaza is not such a big deal after all then I'd be fine sticking with concept II as it is drawn.

Hi Don, et al.,

The two barrier concept, along with the H concept for exit 24, has always been my favorite. At first glance Doug's thoughts about the redesign of the H concept seem reasonable (though I am a little concerned about the complexity of his additions to the northbound thruway exit - it might almost be easier to let western Ave and 90 East traffic continue to exit where they had planned except not have the toll barriers, but that may introduce a weaving problem - have to give this more thought, or let their traffic engineers figure out this detail)

The bottom line is that in my opinion a combination of the two barrier and exit 24 H concepts is the best solution for everybody. I told them so at the public meeting. I think we should let them know this again in case they have not figured it out for themselves yet...
