 > both sides resulting in a slalom course. If the cars are too tightly
 > parks we cannot get larger "ladder" trucks thru and even some of our
 > engines.

 > This must be done with common sense - having mid-night as the cut off
 > time seems unreasonable. From my perspective, keep the regulations with
 > some adjustments that suite the folks living in the neighborhood.
