

Annual meeting May 21st, 1935.

This was a joint meeting with the Ladies Auxiliary and 86 members were present.

Order of business- first reading and approval of minutes of previous meeting.

Mr. Feldman then reviewed briefly the accomplishments of the previous year chief of which was the ^{completion of the} sewer project. Mention was made of the several ~~successful~~ parties held during the year which were a success socially as well as financially. Pres. Feldman also spoke with regret concerning the passing of two of our members, Mr. Witbeck and Mrs. Sanders.

Motion was made that this report be referred to the finance committee and on their approval that the record be placed in the minutes.

Report was made by the committee appointed that together with the committee from the Ladies Aux. the chairs were selected and bought for the Fire Hall. The price was \$150.00, half of which was paid by the Improvement Ass'n and half by the Auxiliary.

Mr. Feldman commented on the dance held and said that receipts totaled about \$100.00

Mr. Conklin read a very detailed and comprehensive report concerning the sidewalks from the Country Club to Knowles Terrace. As Chairman of this committee he gave a resume of what had been done to date toward widening and improving the highway and putting in the walk. He also read a letter from the State Highway Dept. unofficially granting permission to have the sidewalk constructed. Estimated cost was about \$1600.00, 75% of which would be paid by the P.W.A. and 25% by the town.

Mr. Feldman called upon the various home owners directly concerned and with few exceptions all seemed to favor the project, which according to the opinion of most of the residents of our neighborhood, is a much desired improvement both from a standpoint of safety to life as well as a great convenience to pedestrians. Motion was made and seconded that the Ass'n petition the Town Board to build a walk as outlined in the report. Motion was carried with the exception of Mr. Garrison.

A vote of thanks was given to the Sidewalks ~~and~~ committee and the Committee honorably discharged. Approval of their achievements was unanimous.

Election of officers for the ensuing year followed. Directors elected for three years were,
