PENAL LAW

ARTICLE 148

Section 1530. Public Nuisance Defined.

A "public nuisance" is a crime against the order and enonomy of the state, and considts in unlawfully doing an act, or omitting to perforf a duty, which act or omission:

- 1. Annoys, imjures or endangers the comfort, repose, health or safety of any considerable number of persons; or,
- 2. Offends public decency; or,

4. In any way renders a considerable number of persons insecure in life, or the use of property.
