Report of President John F. Feldmann from May 1956 to May 1957.

During the month of May 1956 your Association requested from the Town Superintendent of Highway street and dead end signs for the McKownville Estates area. Also in communication with the State Dept of Public Works relative to the Arterial Highway, which is still under consideration, and in all probability be constructed in the near future.

During June 1956 a notice was served on all residents of the McKownville Sewer District, advising of a Public hearing by the Guilderland Town Board, proposing a new Drainage Sewer from a point near Glenwood street in an easterly direction to the City of Albany line. The public hearing was conducted under the supervision of the Town Board at the Westmere School at which time the majority of those attending did not favor such a project.

At the Board of Directors meeting of Oct. 3, 1956 letters were addresses to the Town Board, re Water conditions, road and street conditions and drainage.

At the suggestion of the Town Board and approved by the McKownville Water District advisory committee the firm of Hall & Company was employed to seek a new water supply from shallow wells. After the expenditure of \$2500.00 the project was dropped as the shallow wells in the vicinity of the pumping station failed to provide an adequate supply to dispose of the present system. In this connection I would recommend the the present filteration plant be enlarged.

A meeting of the Board of Directors held Feb. 27th, 1957 matters pretaing to all water users of the McKownville Water District using the old Water mains was taken under advisement with the suggestion the all such users be connected to the new Water mains. Also matters pretaining Zoning violations

On March 21st, 1957 a general public meeting was held at the Fire House relative the the school bond issue. The issue was ably stated by several members of the Board of Education and its advisory committee.

At invitation of the Board of Education your President and Mrs Zyneickie attended several meetings at the Guilderland High School representing this accociation in preparing the School Budget, which was not acceptable to a large majority of the residents of the Central School District.

During the year Mrs. Ralph Compstock resigned as a member of the Board of Directors. I also regret to report the death of one of our oldest members, Mr. Charles Parsons.
