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# Guilderland Lets Pipe Contract

The Guilderland Town Board has awarded a sewer pipe contract to a Scotia firm after earlier indicating a reopening of bids might be called because of only one bid.

Capitol Concrete Products will provide about 200 feet of piping for improvements to the McKownville sewer district in the vicinity of the former Helme Farms are on Western Avenue.

Councilman Gordon Robinson, while granting that the pipe concern's bid was competitive, had opposed the award in a desire to see more than one bid made on the contract.

However, Town Supervisor John E. King said the award was granted on the advice of the town water engineer, J. Kenneth Fraser, who has passed on the bidding application.

The contract calls for the expenditure of about \$1,400.

It was also pointed out that if new bids were required, the delay in getting the sewer work underway might run over into the wet weather season.
