# McKownville Girl, 10, Dies of Auto Injuries

Funeral services will be held tomorrow for the 10-year-old McKownville girl who died yesterday from injuries received Friday afternoon when she was struck by a car when she ran across Route 20.

Judith Clark of 16 Ayre Drive died in Albany Medical Center Hospital early yesterday morning. She had been rushed to the emergency room there by the Western Turnpike Rescue Squad.

State Police said the girl was returning home from the Stuyvesant Plaza Shopping Center with a friend, Cynthia Smith.

At the intersection of Parkwood Street and Route 20, the girls walked across two lanes of the four lane Route 20 where there is no traffic light.

Police said Miss Smith stopped, but Miss Clark ran across the other two lanes and was

struck by the eastbound car.

Trooper S. L. Sleurs said she was hit by a car driven by Joseph F. MacElliott, 60, of 60 North Lake Avenue. The driver told police that the girl darted into the path of his vehicle and he could not stop in time.

Albany County Coroner Elmer M. Parker gave a decision of accidental death. He said death was caused by multiple fractures and cerebral hemorrhages.

Miss Clark was a student at

the Westmere Elementary School. She was a member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Albany.

She is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Clark, and two brothers, John W. and Robert O. Clark Jr.

The funeral will be at 11 a.m. tomorrow from St. Andrew's Church with the Rev. Ralph M. Carmichael, rector, officiating. Burial will be in Memory Gardens, Colonie.
