

#### Campus Highlights:

- Four dormitory complexes, each housing 1,100 students: 440 in 22-story towers and 660 in three-story units.
- An academic complex of 14 individual buildings, each three stories high. (The academic rectangle will measure approximately 1,440 feet long and 600 feet wide.)
- A library designed for a capacity of a million volumes. Initially part of the library will be utilized for classrooms.
- A Student-Faculty Center serving the entire University.
- A University Theatre, seating 500, with instructional and related service for dramatics and music departments.
- A Lecture Hall Center, hub of the academic complex, with lecture rooms of varying size placed around a center court.
- A sub-surface service corridor to all buildings in the academic complex. Supplies will be delivered to a central point and re-distributed through this system, thereby eliminating vehicular traffic to a point where students will be able to walk between any building on the campus without crossing a street or road.
- Design provisions so physically handicapped students can move about freely through use of ramps or elevators.
- A Health and Physical Education Building for intramural sports and instruction.
- Parking facilities for 3,500 cars.
- A heating plant and central commissary. The plant will circulate high temperature hot water to all buildings. Service to all dining spaces from the central commissary will reduce kitchen and related service space to a minimum.

#### CONSTRUCTION

Scheduled for completion by September 1964:

Site work, dormitory, dining hall, mechanical tunnel, power plant and service buildings.

Scheduled for completion by September 1965, when first students will be on the new campus for academic instruction: Humanities, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Education, Social Science, Student Union, Health and Physical Education buildings, Lecture Hall Center, Library, bell tower, second dormitory and dining hall.

Scheduled for completion by September 1966:

Theatre and Fine Arts Center, Administration, Earth Science and Business Administration buildings, third dormitory and dining hall.

Scheduled for completion after 1966:

Additional dormitory and other facilities as required. A program of expansion has been developed in keeping with the initial campus concept.
