Dear Mr. Dorsey:

Referring to the June 30th letter to Senator Javits, on the need for a Post Office at McKownville, we have no facilities whatever here for outgoing mail. Yet thousands of residents who patronize the big shopping center here can and do buy everything else. With a large volume of gift purchases, numerous office buildings and doctors' offices, as well as the large University here, there are thousands of people who would appreciate a little service from the government.

It is ridiculous to expect people to drive 5 to 10 miles to Albany, or spend 50 cents for bus fare, to purchase stamps, etc. Furthermore no Albany location has parking facilities, which certainly should be provided and which are available at McKownville. Parking is difficult and usually non-existent at the Colonie branch. There is no excuse for such out-moded facilities for post offices.

In vain I have asked the telephone company, insurance companies, magazines, etc. with computer mailing mailing, to show McKownville as well as Albany on my address plate. Consequently, some Albany mail is first delivered to McKownville, and vice versa, due to duplicate street names.

Thank you for arranging for a study by the New York State Regional Director.
