

# McKownville to Have Postal Sub-Station

Hugh Prytherich, the McKownville resident who is leading the fight for a post office in his community, says he would look kindly on the establishment of a "contract station" as suggested by the post Office Department.

first delivered to McKownville and vice versa, due to duplicate street names."

Mr. Prytherich received a letter this week from A. C. Hahn, acting regional director for the department's New York office, who said, "We are authorizing the postmaster, Albany, to advertise for a contract station. If established, this contract station will provide financial service to patrons."

A contract station would serve as a sub-station. Mr. Prytherich hopes that it would serve as a disbursement office, as well as a selling agent. Mr. Prytherich had hoped a new post office might be constructed in McKownville.

"We're not completely satisfied," he said. "We'd still like to get rid of the Albany address. But, we have to take what we can get."

Mr. Prytherich based his request for a post office at McKownville on the fact that "we have no facilities whatever here for out going mail. Yet thousands of residents who patronize the big shopping center here can and do buy everything else . . . and would appreciate a little service from the government."

Mr. Prytherich noted too that there is confusion on addresses since "some Albany mail is
