MCKOWNVILLE WATER SUPPLY

- 1. Fluoridation: Most of equipment installed. A couple of parts are missing. Should be hooked in soon and working.
- 2. Discolored water: Chemist has had great difficultyin stabilizing the water recently. Treatments to correct the overly large iron content have loosened scale in pipes causing discolored water and loose material. He is working on the matter.
- 3. Stuyvesant Plaza Easement: Easement to fill and for parking now before the Water Resources Board whose decision is expected to be favor ble and is awaited momentarily. No hearing is to be held.
- 4. Rates: All commercial users are to be billed at a straight 40 per thousand gals for use over the minimum amount, including Stuyvesant Plaza users, all of whom are metered individually.
- CAMELOT DEVELOPMENT: Between Schoolhouse Road, Kaine Drive and Church Road, 480 units projected, Apartment development.
 - 1 Project to be fenced and to have limited access with guards admiting only persons with business there. Sort of a reverse ghetto.
 - 2. Project to be included in the McKownville Sewer Project WITH SERVICE BY LATE 1970. Developer is Bill Strong (of Heritage Village fame). Now before the Planning Board who have already taken a dim view of private roads, fencing, etc. They would be hooked to the sewers before most areas of McKownville who have been waiting for sewers for some time. Is the sewer designed for such a large user who would double the use of it. Would valuable time be lost in redesigning the sewer to take it. Answers should be found. I believe this project should be fought on these several counts through the Improvement Association.
