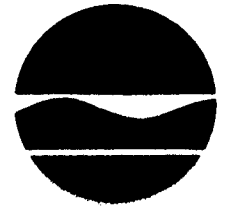

NOTICE OF APPLICATION

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation has received an application from the Town of Guilderland, Albany County, for approval of the taking of a supply of water on a permanent basis from the Westmere Water District as the sole source to supply the McKownville Water District through a Department of Health approved temporary interconnection and meter located near Western Avenue and Schoolhouse Road.

Approval of the taking of such water supply, in amounts up to 450 thousand gallons per day, is required pursuant to Title 15 of Article 15 of the Environmental Conservation Law.

No other Department permits are required. This is an unlisted action pursuant to Article 8 (SEQR) of the Environmental Conservation Law and the Department has determined that no significant adverse environmental impacts will result.

The application may be reviewed at the DEC Region 4 Office at Stamford, New York and at the Office of Regulatory Affairs, 50 Wolf Road, Albany, New York. Any person who wishes to comment, or become a Party-in-Interest at any public hearing which may be held on the application, must submit a statement of the precise grounds for support for, opposition to, or interest in the application to the undersigned no later than June 16, 1980.
