Dear Mrs. Ellinwood:

This is in reply to your letter of February 15, 1983. Please excuse the delay in my response. I wanted to present a new plan to the Town Board on the evening of March 8th, 1983, dealing with the subject of your letter. I wanted to inform the Town Board about my recommendations prior to making them public.

Over the past two months I spoke with many people in the McKownville area about voting on the SUNY Campus. These people expressed opinions very similar to the stand taken by the McKownville Improvement Association. They also requested that the polling place be left at the McKownville Fire Department. I appreciate the Improvement Association's comments as conveyed in your letter. I also appreciated the comments from the other individuals who may or may not be in the Improvement Association. It was based upon their recommendations that I proposed to the Town Board that a new election district be created and numbered District #22. This District has boundaries encompassing the State University of New York insofar as it is situated in the Town of Guilderland. This proposal, approved by the Town Board on March 8th, eliminates the necessity of moving the polling place for those voters in the area of Town along the eastern side of Fuller Road and east of that Road and north of Route 20. I am happy to inform you then, that with the arrival of primary day and election day of this year the voters in the area just referred to will be voting in the McKownville Fire House.
